140,000 Greek Words in the New Testament

400,000 Textual Variants

Why so many variants!?

*Conservative and Rounded

5,800+ Greek Manuscripts
10,000+ Latin manuscripts (starting 2nd century)
5,000-10,000 manuscripts from other languages like Coptic
and Syraic (starting 3rd century)

Estimated 10 million pages of texts!

1,000,000+ scripture quotations from early church fathers that could reproduce the NT several times over

*Conservative and Rounded

Some context...

- Average ancient Greek work has less than 20 copies in existence.
- The range of distance between the author and the earliest copy is usually between 700-1,500 years.
- Average surviving work has about a 4 foot tall stack of books.

*Conservative and Rounded

Dates of NT MSS

- within 125 years we have 43% of all Bible verses

We are getting closer!

1611 - 7 manuscripts - earliest was 11 century

Today - 5800+ manuscripts - earliest is 2nd century

*Conservative and Rounded

But what about the 400,000 variants!

99.75% mean absolutely nothing because Greek is weird

*Conservative and Rounded

0.25% of textual variants are meaningful and viable (Meaning they have a good chance of being authentic)

"No essential Christian belief is jeopardized by any viable variant." - Dr. Daniel B. Wallace
