Hittite Treaty Characteristics

- Preamble- identification of speaker and his titles
- Historical prologue- List of the deeds already performed by the Suzerain on behalf of the vassal
- Stipulations- Terms to be upheld by the vassal for the life of the treaty
- Provision for annual public reading- A copy of the treaty was to be read aloud annually in the vassal state for the purpose of renewal
- Divine witness to the treaty- These usually include the deities of both the Suzerain and the vassal
- Blessings and curses- depending on whether the treaty is upheld or not

Deuteronomy - A Covenant Treaty
Parties

Suzerain: God (The Greater) Vassal: God's people (The Lesser)

More OT Comparison

- Exodus 19:3-8; 24:3-8
- Deuteronomy occurs in book as a whole: I-4 is a historical introduction, 5-II a statement of general principles, I2-26 a statement of specific stipulations, 27-30 a presentation of the curses and blessings, and 3I -34 a setting forth of the provisions for the recognition of Moses' successor and for the continuity of the covenant after his death.
- · Leviticus 23, 26
- Joshua 24: Preamble vs. 2a. Historical introduction vs. 2b·13. Specific stipulations vs. 25. Witnesses vs. 22, 27.
- These are just a few examples


