17 And the Lord appointed a great fish to swallow up Jonah.
And Jonah was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights.

Chapter 2

- 1 Then Jonah prayed to the Lord his God from the belly of the fish, 2 saying,
- "I called out to the Lord, out of my distress, and he answered me; out of the belly of Sheol I cried, and you heard my voice

and the flood surrounded me; all your waves and your billows passed over me. 4 Then I said, 'I am driven away from your sight; yet I shall again look upon your holy temple.'

3 For you cast me into the deep, into the heart of the seas,

5 The waters closed in over me to take my life; the deep surrounded me; weeds were wrapped about my head

> 6 at the roots of the mountains. I went down to the land whose bars closed upon me forever; yet you brought up my life from the pit, O Lord my God.

7 When my life was fainting away, I remembered the Lord, and my prayer came to you, into your holy temple.

8 Those who pay regard to vain idols forsake their hope of steadfast love.

 9 But I with the voice of thanksgiving will sacrifice to you;
 what I have vowed I will pay.
 Salvation belongs to the Lord!"

10 And the Lord spoke to the fish, and it vomited Jonah out upon the dry land.

God's Attributes on Display in Jonah's Story 1. God is in Control of His Creation

1. God is in Control of His Creation

There are consequences when we run from God

Instead of Running From God

".....let us set aside every weight and sin..... and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith..... so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted." Hebrews 12:1-3

Jonah in Desperation Cries Out

Vs 2 "I called out to the Lord, out of my distress...... out of the belly of Sheol I cried"

Vs 4 "I am driven from your sight"

Jonah in Desperation Cries Out

Vs 3,5 & 7 - He's cast into the deep, a flood surrounding him and weeds wrapped around his head.... He's drowning...his life is fainting away

Vs 6 "I went down to the land whose bars closed upon me forever."

Jonah Prays out of Desperation

- vs 2 "from the belly of Sheol I cried and you heard my voice"
- vs 4 & 7 "I shall again look upon your holy temple"...
 - "and I remembered the Lord, and my prayer came to you into your holy temple."

2. God is Merciful

- When we Stop running From God and run To God in Prayer....
- He is Merciful and Listens to our Prayers
